The Proposal:

Write a proposal of no more than two double-spaced pages, excluding bibliography. Describe, as specifically as possible, the topic of your proposed honors project, answering the question "What would you like to analyze, investigate, or research?" You may also include a brief discussion of the approach you'd like to take to your topic. Include a bibliography of primary texts and/or writers to be studied and any other relevant reading you've done on your topic. If you have already worked on this topic in a course (e.g., written a paper or made a presentation), write briefly about what you have done.
